End With Adoration

Matthew 6:13b “For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen.”

We began the “Lord’s Prayer” with praise and thanks to the name of the Lord and now we are taught to end our prayers with the same. God wants us to focus on how big He is, when we pray to Him, not on how big our problems are. David understood this well and modeled it for us in his prayers. Read I Chron. 29:11-13 and note how it parallels Jesus’ ending to the “Lord’s Prayer”.

As we conclude our prayers, we are instructed to praise God that the Kingdom is His. Look up Psalm 103:19 and Daniel 7:27 and write down the truths you discover about the Kingdom and also why those truths are a powerful thing to remember to praise God for when we pray: _____

We’re also told to praise God for His power. The word for “power” used here is where we get our word “dynamite” from. Look up Jeremiah 32:17 and then share your thoughts as to why it’s important to remember God’s power when we pray. _____

As a third directive, Jesus tells us to finish our prayers by acknowledging that the glory is God’s as well. Why is this important and how does this help us to keep a right perspective in all our prayers? (Isaiah 42:8, Ps 24:8-10) _____

Look up the following verses and write down how

they help us to understand better how and why we should end our prayers in praise to God as Jesus has instructed us to here:

Heb 13:15/I Thess 5:16-18 (How does “ending with adoration” fulfill these verses?) _____

Phil 4:6,7 (What good things happen inside of us when we do what it says here?) _____

Eph 5:18-20 (How does “ending with adoration” help us to be filled with the Spirit?) _____
