You Can Only Have One Master!

Matthew 6:24 “No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon.”

In our last lesson we looked at how the “evil eye” of covetousness brings great darkness into our lives and leads us down a road of spiritual destruction. Now Jesus uses the analogy of a servant and master to help us to understand what our relationship to mammon (money and stuff) should be.

9. In Matthew 22:36-38 Jesus told the lawyer what the greatest commandment is. How does the greatest commandment relate to this idea that we can only serve one master? _____
